1. Introduction

“The enjoyment of the highest attainable standard of health is one of the fundamental rights of every human being without distinction of race, religion, political belief, economic or social condition,” the World Health Organization (WHO) declared as part of its Constitution in 1946. Almost 70 years after these words were adopted by the organization, they are more powerful and relevant than ever today.

As one of the leading health organizations in Nigeria, Sakinah Medical Outreach also believes everyone deserves the right to quality healthcare services, most especially the vulnerable ones. And for over 10 years, we have worked as an organization with poor Nigerians in accessing quality healthcare services. To achieve this, we have designed several medical intervention projects and organized several medical outreach events to reach out to marginalized communities. This year, Sakinah has supported poor Nigerians seeking medical intervention, through its ‘individual intervention project’, which provides free quality healthcare services to the indigent. Between January 2021 and June 2021, the following are the statistics relating to our operations:

Approved Cases – 12

Pending Cases- 27

3. Application Process

During application for the individual intervention, the following process was followed;

- Online Application:

Application form is available on Sakinah website (www.sakianhoutreach.org) for easy access. Anyone in need of our services can fill out the form online, and submit with the support documentation. From the submitted forms, our assessors will be able to have crucial details about the applicants, the nature of the sickness, ongoing treatment plans (if any), and the consent form. This form allows us to have an overview of the condition of applicants to be able to take informed decision.

- Collation and Submission of Applications:

Forms submitted via the website are collated by the administrative office and submitted to the management for review. The first review is done by the admin officer, to ascertain that the forms were correctly filled before forwarding them for verification.

- Verification:

After collation and submission, the application is reviewed by professional medical doctors to ascertain the validity of any complaint. Telephone calls, video calls, and physical examination are also used to verify the originality of applications.


- Approval:

If an application is considered valid, it is approved based on urgency, available funds, and the treatment procedure involved (which is then carried out as suggested).

4. Summary of Applicants

The Sakinah application form for the individual intervention project is open throughout the year, as such applications are continuously received. Since the beginning of this year (2021), a total of 39 applications have been received across Nigeria, and have been processed. The figures below show the geographic distribution of the applicants. Sadly, the organization is heavily limited in its ambition to touch more lives due to lack of fund. Therefore, only few applications could be approved for medical intervention.

Figure 1: Map of Nigeria Showing Where Applications Were Received From.




5. Impacts

— Demographic Data of Processed Applications

The figure below is the demographic representation of applications that was processed from January to June 2021. A total of 39 applications were received and processed. 41.0% were male, while 59% were female. Also, the age of most applicants, 44.0% were old aged (Above 55), followed by 18.0% older adults (20 - 44) and teenagers (13 -19), while the 12.0% were children (Below 12 years). Lastly, the most diagnosed health issue were individuals with cancer (31.0%), followed by kidney and lungs diseases (23.0%), neuro-disorder (15.0%), cataracts, and congenital heart diseases (13.0%), while other health issues (5.0%) include accident victims, appendicitis, hernia, and fibroid.


Figure 2: Demographic Data of Processed Applications



— Demographic Data of Approved and Treated Cases

The figure below is the demographic representation of approved and treated cases from January to June 2021. A total of 10 cases has been approved, 7 completed treatments, while 3 are still undergoing some form of treatment. 70.0% were male, while 30.0% were females. Also, for most individuals, 20.0% were children (below 12) and old-aged (above 55), while 10.0% are older adults (45 - 55) and teenagers (13- 19), and 40.0% are young adults (20 - 44). Most cases treated were emergency (40%) which include accident victims, and appendicitis. Also, 30.0% of treated cases were cataracts, followed by 20.0% neuro-disorder and 10.0% congenital heart disease. Lastly, the duration of most ailments 40.0% were less than 1 year, while 20.0% were between 1- 5 years and some above 5 years.
